## Concert Band - Course Syllabus James Island Charter High School



Course Description: Concert Band is a performing ensemble, designed for students who demonstrate intermediate technical skills on their instrument. This course is designed to build on the foundational skills learned in middle school or a previous year of high school band. Students will continue to develop musicianship, technique, and performance-related music theory skills in this course. Students will study a varied repertoire of music ranging from grade levels III to V. While minimal, students should expect that some activities may occur outside of the regular class period. Attendance at after-school rehearsals and performances is required. Marching Band participation, while not mandatory, is highly encouraged for all students enrolled in this course.

## Course Goals:

1. Students will develop individual and ensemble skills (components of playing), including tone production, timing, intonation, breathing, embouchure, fingering, rhythm, style, phrasing, articulation and scales (technique). They will use these collectively and simultaneously in expressive musical performance.
2. Through the rehearsal/performance process, students will improve musicianship and technical facility on their respective instruments.
3. Students will be able to demonstrate and maintain proper posture, instrument placement, and breathing technique.
4. Students will learn and regularly test all twelve major scales, and be able to play comfortably and confidently in all twelve major keys.
5. Students will be able to perform the All-State required chromatic scale with a characteristic tone quality in all registers.
6. Students will study/rehearse/perform music of varying levels of difficulty and styles.
7. Students will continue developing reading and writing skills in standard music notation.
8. Students will be able to clap, sing, and play rhythms in a variety of combinations and meters.
9. Students will study the common elements of music and develop a vocabulary to discuss and describe music.
10. Students will be able to speak and write intelligently about music from evaluating a variety of musical performances.
11. Students will be able to improvise melodies in several keys and add original material to incomplete melodies.
12. Students will gain a rudimentary understanding of the history of Western Classical Music, their instrument, and other related topics.
13. Students will demonstrate basic care and maintenance for their respective instruments.
14. Students will become independent musicians, participating in Region Band, All-State Band, Solo \& Ensemble, and other individual/ensemble opportunities.

## Grading Policy:

Rehearsal Skills 15\% - Students are expected to have their music/materials every day, a pencil at every rehearsal, all while showing maximum effort to be an active member of our ensemble.
$>$ Arrives to rehearsal on time and ready to play when the Director steps onto the podium.
To be early is to be on time. To be on time is to be late. To be late is to be unacceptable.
$>$ Follows directions the first time they are given
> Use appropriate posture, technique and hand/instrument position at all times
$>$ Stops playing immediately and listens for critique when director stops conducting
$>$ Knows at all times what section of the music is being rehearsed
$>$ Has appropriate materials in class (instrument, music, pencil, tuner, reeds, valve oil)
$>$ Properly puts materials away at the end of rehearsal

## Rehearsal Expectations

- Be on time and participate in all rehearsals, concerts, masterclasses and clinics.
- Students are expected to be in their seat with music, instruments, and all equipment, ready to play 2 minutes after the bell. If you arrive late, do not disrupt the learning that is already in process.
- Come to rehearsal with a good attitude.
- Students are expected to have a pencil with them at all times.
- Students are expected not to talk while the teacher is on the podium so as not to disrupt the rehearsal. Students will be given time between pieces to talk before beginning the next piece.
- At the end of rehearsal, put materials back in their proper place.
- Assume responsibility for your own actions. Admit when you are wrong.
- Respect yourself, your peers, your equipment, and those in authority.
- Cell phone use is strictly prohibited unless the teacher asks the student to use it for educational purposes.

## Fall Semester

## Spring Semester

- Students work each week in class for 1 hour
- Teacher works from group to group coaching students - focusing on

- Groups will perform for class at the week before Spring Break in the middle of April for a grade
- Groups who have successfully prepared their music will perform at the Spring Chamber Ensemble Concert and possibly the SCBDA Solo and Ensemble Festival at the end of April

Chamber music experiences develop musical independence and increase personal responsibilities of students individually to what is on the page. While some aspects of chamber ensemble playing differ from large ensembles, it still means we emphasize playing with exemplary tone, intonation, balance, expression, clarity of articulation. Every musical decision a student makes in a chamber music experience is amplified - including the decision of how well they prepare for rehearsal. Students intimately learn to pay attention to other lines, refine their listening skills, increase confidence in playing, and develop technical and analytical skills that carry over to a larger group.

Trust between members is enhanced and tested. Students find their voice in a chamber group much easier than a larger ensemble, take ownership of musical decisions, and become more invested in their band program. Mentoring and sharing of knowledge between students is more common as part of the rehearsal process. Students have opportunities to take on enhanced leadership responsibilities, and a sense of mutual cooperation towards a shared goal becomes very tangible.
